



# Heart to Heart<sup>®</sup> Caladium Planting

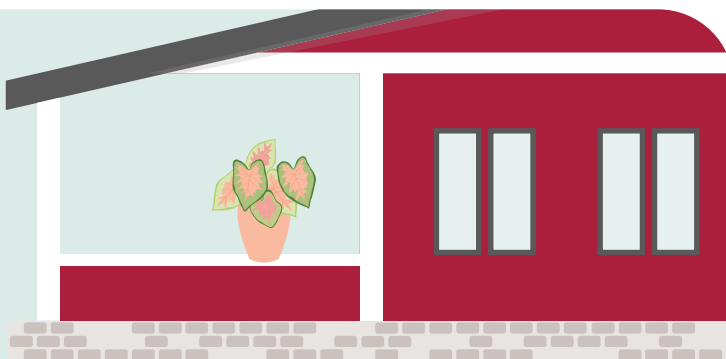
**BEFORE PLANTING**



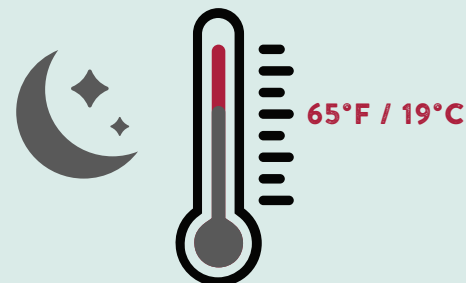
Follow these planting steps to have the most success with your caladium bulbs. Remember, all caladiums grow in and love shade or partial shade. There are some bred for full sun and thrive in it.

## REMEMBER

- Mulching helps preserve soil moisture.
- Caladiums like moist, but not soggy soil.
- As lower leaves age and fade, you can pinch at the base to remove.



Pick the perfect location or container:  
Caladiums can be heat and sun tolerant, but remember caladiums love filtered light and shade. Shelter from drying winds.



Wait to plant a few weeks after the last frost, and ideally when temperatures are consistently above 65°F / 19°C at night.

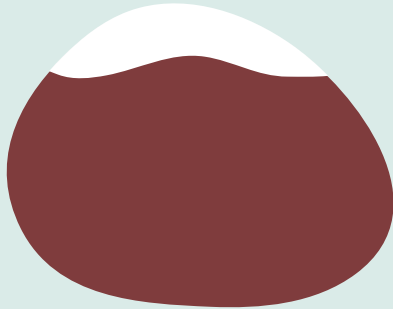


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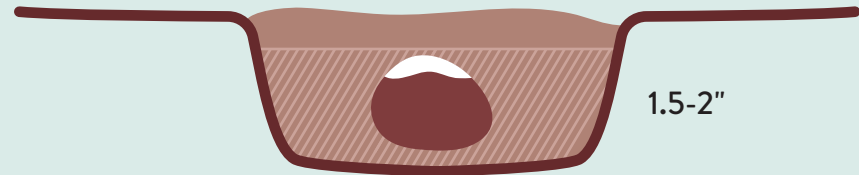

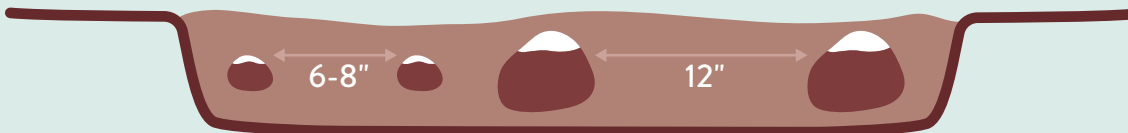
Find the painted white side of the bulb.

Plant the bulb 1.5-2" deep into the soil with the painted side up.

Space smaller bulbs at least 6-8" apart and jumbo bulbs (small fist size) closer to 12" apart.

Cover and give a slow, deep watering with room temperature or warm water. Keep soil very moist until bulbs emerge.
